The official language of the Conference was English.

The Conference is included in the Register of congresses, symposia and scientific conferences of the Ukrainian Ministry of Health in 2012 and is the only forum at this level for the time of Ukraine's independence.

INTERNATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP IN AESTHETIC RESTORATION OF TEETH



The policy of our state in the field of higher education is directed towards integration into the world system with preservation of the achievements and traditions of the Ukrainian school. Participation of our students and interns in different workmanship competitions is one of the variants for the above approaching.

Thus, colleagues from University of Chieti (Italy) suggested the Department of Dentistry of our University that we take part in the International championship in aesthetic restoration of teeth, whose participants represent many European universities. The competition, supported by the Italian Ministry of Health and one of the most famous manufacturers of dental materials, MICE-RIUM SpA, is held for the eight time. Also, it is worth noticing that our University is the only educational institution of this type in Ukraine, which was invited to participate.

The competition procedure envisages realization of certain stages. Thus, during stage I, all the interns were theoretically trained in one of the modern

techniques of tooth res-

toration, namely the technique of anatomic stratification following Dr. Lorenzo Vanini's method. Teachers of our Department of Dentistry were provided with guidelines and visual aids. Then, on March 1, our University held stage II: a practical course for a group of interns under the guidance of Prof. Camillo D'Arcangelo from University of Chieti. Before the practical course the professor delivered a lecture for all comers on the basic principles of the stratification technique

and properties of Enamel Plus restoration system.



The second stage ended with a competition on plaster casts, where interns demonstrated their theoretical and practical skills. On the basis of these works, staff members of the Department and representatives from the Italian part will choose the best participant. The evaluation criteria will include such items as matching of the performed work by colour, fullness and brightness; natural reproduction of opalescence and intensity, macrorelief and microstructure of the surface; quality of the final polishing, and some other characteristics. All the information about the winner will be sent to MICERIUM SpA.

The third stage consists in the final international championship, which will take place at the Department of Restorative Dentistry, University of Chieti, on June 13. All transport, hotel and rest costs of the participants will be covered by the sponsor. Prof. Camillo D'Arcangelo

INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

A LECTURE FOR YOUNG SCIENTISTS AND STUDENTS

On March 20, 2012 Kharkiv National Medical University was visited by an expert on software in the healthcare system from the USA.

Lana TSURIKOVA, the Research Program manager of Partners HealthCare System, Inc., Clinical Informatics R & D, USA, met with our students, young scientists and interns. Her lecture "Health IT today: role, components, and challenges" dealt with the history of software development in the field of health, reviews of companies and industrial products today, implementation of new data processing technologies, and other aspects.

In the USA, an integrated health care system was founded by Brigham and Women's Hospital (BWH) and Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH) in 1994. It includes founding hospitals, community hospitals, specialty hospitals, post acute care services and community health centers. The mission of Partners HealthCare System, Inc. is to improve the quality and efficiency of care for patients by assuring that the most advanced current knowledge in medical informatics (clinical computing) is incorporated into clinical information systems.

An electronic health record is an evolv-





ing concept defined as a systematic collection of electronic health information about individual patients or populations. It is a digital format record, which is theoretically capable of being shared across different health care settings. In some cases, this sharing can be performed by means of network-connected enterprise-wide information systems and other information networks or exchanges. Digital medical documentation resources make it possible for medical staff to have an access to the case history of every patient, while the patient can be treated worldwide regardless of his/her nationality and country of residence

Application of these programs in healthcare systems, training of medical staff and improvement of knowledge in medical informatics will reduce the time of clinical diagnosis assessment and administration of the correct treatment to the patient.

The Head of Department of Propedeutics of Internal Medicine No. 1 O.M. KOVALY-OVA noted that the above meeting provided an opportunity for international cooperation with foreign experts in the field of health and introduction of new technologies into the work of our hospitals.

FIRST STEPS ON THEIR WAY TO GREAT SCIENCE

The second year of the work of the Preparatory Department for Foreign Citizens of KhNMU is being over. Within this time the number of our listeners from different countries increased: students from Nigeria, Azerbaijan and Iraq were also joined by representatives from Israel, India, Afghanistan, Turkey, Zimbabwe and the Maldives.

The present academic year is to finish one month earlier, many listeners started their studies only in winter, but the curricula will be fully completed owing to the work of experienced lecturers and a responsible attitude of most listeners to their studies.

By the results of the winter session, actually all the listeners passed their examinations and tests with "good" and "excellent" results, 7 people received diplomas from the Head of the Department for their successes. But poor achievers attended extra classes.

Foreign students are interested in the history of Ukraine, that of Kharkiv in particular. They go on excursions, attend exhibitions, take an interest in Ukrainian national holidays, and describe ancient and modern customs in their native countries.

The Russian language seems very difficult for them. But they diligently try to master it, take an interest in a comparative analysis of the "great and powerful" Russian and their mother tongues, and deliver reports at conferences. This year the works have been presented by: Narware Nilima (India) – "India: The Unknown about Known" at the 74th International Students' Conference at Kharkiv National Automobile and Highway University; Ahmed Raliat and Salawu Khayrat (Nigeria) – "Proverbs unite..." about sounding and meaning of proverbs in the Russian, English and Yoruba languages. Abulfaz Osmanzade (Azerbaijan) made a report "Animals as Causative Agents of Human Parasitic Diseases"

(the 11th Interuniversity Theoretical-Practical Conference of International Students from Preparatory Faculties and Departments of Ukraine at the National Pharmaceutical University), Jafarzade Rahshanda (Azerbaijan) presented a report "Why it is difficult for me to study the Russian language" about peculiarities in the Azerbaijani language versus the Russian one. Murindagomo Cathrine (Zimbabwe) and Akonjom Mandus (Nigeria) explained why they wanted to become doctors; Javadli Parviz (Azerbaijan) described "The biological role of vitamins" (the 1st International Theoretical-Practical Conference of International Students from Preparatory and Basic Faculties and Listeners of Centres for Training Foreign Citizens at Higher Schools, held at Kharkiv National University of Radioelectronics).

All the speeches were accompanied by bright illustrative materials, the presenters being awarded with diplomas and prizes.

Their participation in the conferences became the first significant achievement and a high stimulus to study for the reporters. Their study at a preparatory department for foreign citizens is the most important stage in the life of any person, who has come to Ukraine in order to get knowledge and gain victories.


WONDERFUL PLACES OF UKRAINE
