The purpose of the visit was to get acquainted with the history and modern development of the University, as well as to discuss the issues of cooperation.



HONORARY GUESTS OF KHNMU Palliative medicine is a requirement of the time

On November 10, a delegation of the founders of the public organization for parents who have children with disabilities "Parents2" from the Netherlands visited the University. Namely, Mr. Rene Hubregtze, the Director of the NGO, Mrs. Nellie Oversluisen, the Professor of Nursing at the Christian University, and Mr. Willem Peter van Kempen, a volunteer for people with disabilities and their relatives.

The meeting was initiated by the Professor of the Department of Paediatrics No. 1 with Neonatology, Mrs. Olena Riga. The purpose of the visit was to discuss opportunities for cooperation in the field of paediatric palliative care, drawing up a lecture course for students, doctors and academia.

Welcoming foreign guests at KhNMU, the Vice-Rector for Research, Prof. Valeriy Myasoyedov pointed out that palliative medicine is not only the latest tendency, but also a requirement of the time, for this the University is trying to follow modern trends. "Currently, we are creating a Centre for Palliative Medicine in our University. The tasks of the Centre are education, science and practical activities. However, this should happen in the context of international cooperation, because there are international standards for palliative care in the world. and we want them to be established in Ukraine as well. By bringing together experts, qualified international managers, people involved in education, science and the arts, we can get the results we expect. I hope that during our meeting we will be able to outline areas of interest to both you and us" - said the Vice-Rector. Mr. Rene Hubregtse, for his part, reminded how the cooperation between our institutions was set and gave an appraisal of it, saying, "We are very happy to visit your school again and hope to continue this tradition in the future. Ukrainian medics have a great desire to develop palliative care, and I hope that your University will be a good example of it".

During the visit, the guests discussed issues of further cooperation in the field of supporting children with special needs. After visiting the National Museum, they also got acquainted with the history of Kharkiv National Medical University and phantom classes at the Simulation Centre of the Institute of Educational Quality.

Lecture by Plamen Staykov



The Professor of the Department of Pediatric Dentistry and Implantology Lyudmila Kryvenko opened the dental field of the conference, the assistants Ksenia Lepilina and Oksana Tishchenko also presented the results of research conducted at the Department. The reports focused on a topical and socially significant issue in Dentistry, namely the relationship between smoking and alternative smoking methods with changes in the dental status of young patients. These

studies are part of research work performed at the department and actively presented in the international publications.

Assoc. Prof. Anton Tkachenko, the Head of the Research Institute of Experimental and Clinical Medicine, presented a report in the field of nanotoxicology. The Professor of the Department of Tuberculosis

and Pulmonology Dmytro Butov highlighted the global issues of the treatment of co-infection with tuberculosis and HIV.

As a result of the participation in the Congress, some of the advanced scientific and practical developments of our University were presented, supported by the Ministry of Health of Ukraine, international relations were established, which will lead to the development of innovative research areas.

The Science Slam event for graduate students was organized with the support of USERN on the eve of the

World Science Day which is celebrating on November 10. Science Slam is a new format of competition for young scientists, developed to facilitate the understanding of major scientific results by the general public. Young scientists spoke about the main scientific ideas of present and their own research in an informal setting. Participants had to present their scientific achievements in an accessible and interesting way to the unprepared audience. Each participant had 10 minutes to present his idea in a witty, accessible and interesting way, and the audience determined the best by voting. All the participants without exception, were able to immerse themselves in science, creativity and humor!

Another part of the Congress was the International Festival of Paintings for Paediatric Patients (IFPPP), which is co-organized annually by the local USERN office at the University.
