Kharkiv National Medical University was represented at the conference by: Vice-Rector for Scientific and Pedagogical Work Oleksandr Kryvoshapka, Head of the Mental Health Center Volodymyr Korosty, and Head of the Department of Disaster Medicine and Military Medicine Yuliia Volkova. They presented the activities of KhNMU and the university clinic, and discussed ways of further cooperation with Czech partners.

The focus of the conference is the development of the rehabilitation system, modernization of medical institutions, international medical partnerships, exchange of experience with military doctors of the Czech Republic and university clinics.

During the visit, the delegation of the KhNMU got acquainted with modern Czech medical institutions, in particular in the field of mental health, rehabilitation, obstetrics and gynecology. A separate stage was the trip of Yuliia Volkova to the Military Hospital in Prague and the university clinic in Brno.

On January 21, 2025, Kharkiv National Medical University signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Nottingham Trent University

(NTU) in an online format. The ceremony was the result of previous meetings within the framework of the #TwinForHope conference, which took place in Warsaw in July 2024.

The rector of Kharkiv National Medical University, Valerii Miasoiedov, expressed gratitude to the British side for supporting Ukraine and emphasized the importance of international educational partnership in times of war. Particular attention was paid to the areas of nursing, social work, rehabilitation and prosthetics.

On July 20–25, 2025, a delegation of the Kharkiv National Medical University, consisting of the First Vice-Rector for Scientific and Pedagogical Work Nataliia Savielieva and the Head of the Department of International Relations and Grant Work Oksana Vasyliieva, paid a working visit to Nottingham Trent University (NTU, Great Britain).

The visit took place at the invitation of the leadership of the Institute of Health and Allied Professions of NTU and with the support of grant funding from The Burdett Trust for Nursing UK.

The purpose of the visit was to supervise the students of the Kharkiv National Medical University who were undergoing a three-week clinical internship in the specialty «Nursing» at the clinical bases of NTU.

The program of the stay included:

- meetings with the leadership of the faculties of social sciences, mental health and psychology;
- discussion of models of social support, innovations in medical technologies and simulation training;
- visits to the teaching and clinical departments of NTU and Nottingham University Hospitals Trust.

The visit contributed to the deepening of the strategic partnership between KhNMU and NTU in the areas of medical education, research and international academic mobility, and also provided an opportunity to begin work on the development of a system of double degrees between the universities.

INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS**KHNMU AT THE SESAM-2025 CONGRESS IN VALENCIA**

On June 25–27, 2025, the 30th anniversary congress of the SESAM Society, the leading European forum for simulation medicine, was held in Valencia (Spain), which brought together 1,377 participants from 65 countries. Among them were almost 70 representatives of Ukraine.

KhNMU was represented at the event by the Director of the Simulation Center, Tetiana Merkulova, with a poster report on the work of the Center in wartime conditions (within the framework of the Ukrainian-Swiss project «Development of Medical Education»), as well as the Head of the Department of Military Medicine, Yuliia Volkova, and the Head of the International Department, Oksana Vasylieva, with a report on the Erasmus+ SimS project.

During the congress, a cooperation agreement was signed between UASIM and SESAM, which opens up new prospects for Ukrainian specialists. The representatives of KhNMU also personally thanked the President of SESAM, Professor Pier Luigi Ingrassia, for his support of Ukraine. Since 2022, the participation of the Russian Federation in SESAM has been completely suspended, and Ukrainians can join for free.

UKRAINIAN MEDICAL EDUCATION — IN THE FOCUS OF THE INTERNATIONAL AUDIENCE



Representatives of the Educational and Scientific Institute for Foreign Citizens took part in international educational exhibitions in April 2025.

Thus, on April 12–13, the 33rd Student Educational Forum – a large-scale educational exhibition for Moroccan youth – was held in Casablanca (Kingdom of Morocco).

The participation of the ESIFC in the event was organized with the assistance of the Embassy of Ukraine in the Kingdom of Morocco and the Ukrainian State Center for International Education (UDCME) of the Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine. Ukrainian higher education institutions had the opportunity to present their educational programs under special conditions of participation as part of a joint Ukrainian delegation.

Participation in the forum allowed our university to expand its network of international partnerships, establish contacts with Moroccan educational institutions, and present the Ukrainian system of higher medical education and educational opportunities for foreign students.

Representatives of the ESIFC also participated in international educational exhibitions organized by the international company Beggin Group with the support of the UDCMO, which took place on April 12 in Istanbul (Turkey) and April 13 in Baku (Azerbaijan).

The purpose of participation was to conduct career guidance work among graduates of schools in Turkey and Azerbaijan, present the educational opportunities of the university, and attract applicants to study at KhNMU.

INTERNSHIP IN THE UK

A NEW EXPERIENCE FOR KHNMU STUDENTS



As part of a three-week academic mobility, students of Kharkiv National Medical University undergo practical training at NTU clinical facilities, in particular in the departments of craniofacial surgery, ra-

diology, hematology and palliative care of Nottingham Hospitals NHS Trust.

During the internship, students: participate in premedication, anesthesia, observe angiography on modern equipment; study in a simulation center that simulates complex clinical scenarios; get acquainted with the British model of palliative care – a multidisciplinary approach, patient and family support, priority of dignity and quality of life.

The use of complementary therapies (music therapy, aromatherapy, relaxation) is especially impressive, which significantly improve the patient's experience.

A key discovery for students was the role of Advanced Clinical Practitioners (ACP) – nurses with extended powers: maintaining documentation, evaluating examination results, prescribing treatment. Nursing medical history is a separate document that is currently absent in the Ukrainian system.

The organization of the medical process in the UK is impressive in its efficiency – from logistics to interprofessional interaction. The main goal is high-quality care and optimization of medical staff time.

Such an internship forms clinical thinking, professional autonomy and readiness to implement international standards in practice.

OSCI-2025: CERTIFICATION OF FOREIGN GRADUATES OF KHNMU

QUALITY TRAINING — HIGH RESULTS



In June 2025, graduates of the Educational and Scientific Institute for the Training of Foreign Citizens of Kharkiv National Medical University passed the objective structured clinical exam (OSCI). This year, more than 100 foreign students were admitted to the certification.

The exams were held in a hybrid format in the main clinical areas: therapy, surgery, pediatrics, obstetrics and gynecology, emergency medicine. The evaluation process was closely monitored by the examination commission headed by Professor Natalia Makieieva with the participation of the Director of the Education and Research Institute for Training of International Citizens Dmitro Marakushyn.

Previously, the students successfully passed the Step 2 test in certified international centers. The final stage of certification confirmed the high level of training and proper quality of practical skills, which is a priority in the educational process of KhNMU.

INTERNATIONAL INTERNSHIP

ON THE WAY TO EUROPEAN EXPERIENCE IN NEUROSURGERY



At the end of January 2025, the annual training course of the European Association of Neurosurgeons was held in Helsinki (Finland). The event brought together more than 150 participants – young doctors and leading experts from Europe and the USA.

Vladyslav Kaliuzhka, a postgraduate student of the Department of Neurosurgery, took part in the course from Kharkiv National Medical University. He deepened his professional knowledge and established international contacts with neurosurgeon colleagues.

The key topics of this year's event were traumatic brain injuries and functional neurosurgery (epilepsy, Parkinson's disease, chronic pain syndromes), which are of great importance for modern Ukrainian medicine.

The program included discussion groups, sessional discussions of complex clinical cases, as well as master classes on preoperative planning using neuronavigation technologies and modern surgical equipment.

Participation in the live-surgery course, which was held at the Helsinki University Hospital – one of the leading centers for surgical treatment of brain pathologies, was especially valuable.

A STEP TOWARDS INNOVATIONS IN UKRAINIAN NEUROSURGERY

In March 2025, Vladyslav Kalyuzhka, a graduate student of the Department of Neurosurgery, completed an internship at Nagoya University (Nagoya University, Japan), one of the world's leading centers in the field of neurosurgery and medical research.



During the internship, Vladyslav became familiar with advanced clinical approaches to the treatment of patients with neurosurgical pathology, in particular in the areas of vascular and tumor neurosurgery. He participated in surgical interventions, studied the work of a multidisciplinary team, mastered modern neuroimaging methods, intraoperative technologies, including navigation systems, operating microscopes and robotic complexes.

A valuable part of the internship was work at the Helsinki University Hospital. Nagoya, where the postgraduate student got acquainted with the organization of the surgical process, interaction between

clinical departments and principles of management of modern medical infrastructure in Japan.

The internship included participation in scientific seminars, clinical reviews and discussions of current research. Special attention was paid to the topic of postoperative complications after subarachnoid hemorrhage and microsurgery of extra-intracranial anastomoses – a direction that Vladyslav is working on within the framework of his scientific activities.



The experience gained will be a significant contribution to the development of Ukrainian neurosurgery and will contribute to the integration of modern medical technologies into the practice of domestic healthcare institutions.

ACADEMIC MOBILITY

TARSUS UNIVERSITY THROUGH THE EYES OF A STUDENT



At the end of June, second-year students of the 4th Faculty of Medicine, Maria Dolia and Anastasia Chernova-Shmykova, successfully completed a semester of study under the international academic mobility program (within the framework of the Erasmus+ project) at Tarsus University (Mersin, Turkey) in the specialty «Therapy, Rehabilitation». Academic mobility of students is extremely important for our university in times of war, as it makes it possible to ensure the continuity of high-quality education, integrate into the international academic community and preserve the future of Ukrainian medicine.

We offer to learn about the girls' impressions of studying in Turkey firsthand:

«We completed a semester of study at Tarsus University in Turkey. This trip was a valuable experience for us: we were able to combine theoretical knowledge with practical skills, work with modern methods, and also communicate with teachers who were open to questions, discussions, and supported our initiative.

Each subject began with a review of the previous material and an explanation of a new topic. We liked the disciplines of manipulative therapy and pediatrics the most. The pairs were held in a mixed language format: for Turkish students, they taught in Turkish, and for us, in English.

Manipulative therapy was taught by Volkan Deniz – his approach to teaching combined a theoretical basis with practice. Each lesson began with a discussion of the rehabilitation of a certain part of the body, a detailed explanation of the techniques, after which we practiced the theory in pairs on each other.
